

Frequently Asked Questions

What days is the Meram City and Life Culture Museum open?

It is open to visitors every day of the week except Mondays between 09.30-17.30.

How much is the entrance fee for the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

It is 150 TL for adults, 70 TL for students and 250 TL for foreign visitors. It is free of charge for children aged 0-6 years under the supervision of their parents. It is free for the relatives of martyrs and veterans (Mother, father, spouse or child). The visit fee is 50 TL for citizens of the Republic of Turkey with disabilities or over the age of 65.

Is there a special discount for groups at the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

Adult entrance fee is 100 TL, student entrance fee is 50 TL and foreign visitor entrance fee is 200 TL for groups of at least 10 people.

Where is the Meram City and Life Culture Museum located?

It is located in Konya province, Meram district. The full address of the museum is: Durunday Neighborhood, Dutlu Avenue No: 111 Meram District Konya Province.

Is the Museum Card valid at the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

No. Our museum is not included among the facilities visited with a Museum Card.

Can we take photos at the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

There are many areas in the museum where you can take photos.

Can I visit the Meram City and Life Culture Museum with my baby?

There is no access to our houses with a baby carriage. It is only suitable for carrying the baby in the arms. Our baby care room is available for you to meet your needs during your visit.

Is there a library in the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

There is no library in our museum. You can buy books about the History and Culture of Meram from our store.

What is on display at the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

There is a permanent exhibition supported by ethnographic material that shows how the people who lived in Meram maintained certain stages of their lives depending on the place. Being Born, Being Living, Being Circumcised, Being Co-in-law, Wedding and After-wedding, Pilgrim Visits, Illness and Death, Courtyard, Kitchen, Vineyard and Garden culture in Meram are described.

What workshops are there in the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

There are gastronomy and handicraft workshops, especially workshops about traditional Konya Dishes.

Who can participate in Workshops and Events?

The workshops are open to everyone who meets the conditions specified in the announcements.

What do I need to do to participate in Workshops and Events?

You can participate to our Workshops by registering online at "www.muzemeram.com".

Should I bring materials with me for the workshop?

The workshop materials are provided by the Meram City and Life Culture Museum. If there is no note about personal materials in the details, you do not need to bring materials.

How long before the Workshop and Event time should we be at the museum?

You must be at the museum at least 15 minutes before the specified time.

When should we notify if we want to postpone or cancel the reservation?

You need to notify us at least a week in advance.

What happens if we are late to the reservation time?

If there is a delay of more than 15 minutes, the reservation will be cancelled.

Is there a parking space for a personal car, a shuttle car or a tour bus?

Our museum has an outdoor parking lot.

Is there a gift shop in the Meram City and Life Culture Museum?

Yes, we have a store in our museum.

What products are sold in the Meram City and Life Culture Museum Store?
